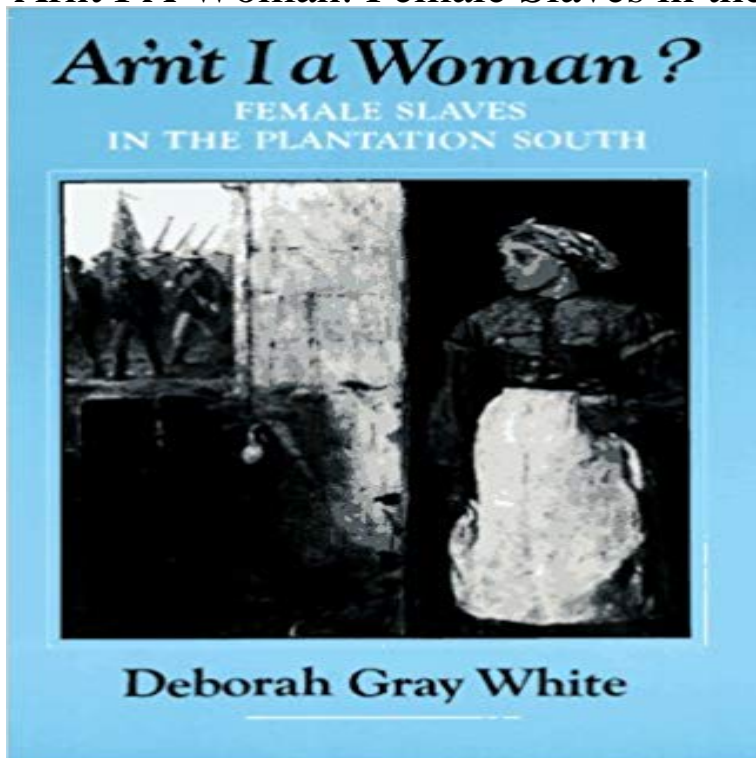


Arnt I A Woman: Female Slaves in the Plantation South
