

The anatomical signs of dysentery are, enlargement and ulceration of the caecal and colonic solitary glands, consequent on acute inflammation of these glands; just as enlargement and ulceration of the iliac agminated and solitary glands are the anatomical marks of one form of typhus, as a peculiar change in the liver is the mark of yellow fever (Loins), or as certain alterations in the liver and spleen are the anatomical appearances of malignant remittent fever. But the pathology of a disease is a term which includes all the relations such a disease may have to other allied affections. The pathology of dysentery cannot be said to be known till we understand all the causes which produce its anatomical marks, the steps which changes so induced pass through, and all the phenomena they generate., It is at once apparent how much remains to be determined before this comprehensive pathology can be made out. must be understood, the alliance between the colon and liver, and skin,...
