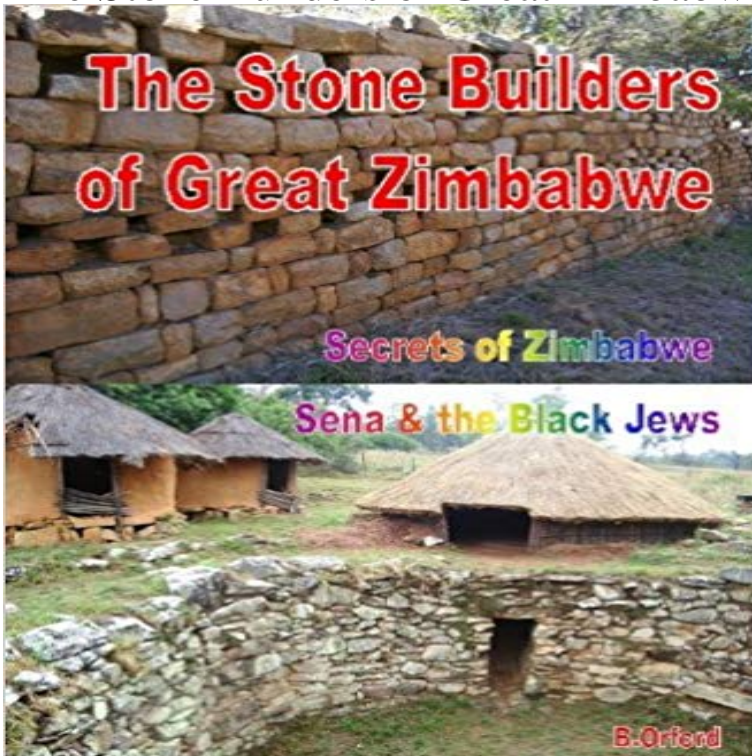


## The Stone Builders of Great Zimbabwe
